

Journal Entries

All students will be required to complete 6 journal entries. These journal entries will provide you with a way to reflect and process on what they have researched and learned. In order to write a good journal entry students should refer to the following journal guidance:

What makes a good journal entry?

- 1. S-O-Q:** Summarize the text, observe interesting points, and pose questions.
- 2. Character/Author analysis:** How do the leaders of the movement act? What does that tell you about him/her? What do you think about him/her?
- 3. Connect:** How does the piece make you feel? Did it change your opinion on what the best tactic against injustice is? What connections can you make between your research and your life experiences?
- 4. Reflect:** What were you thinking while you were learning? Why were you thinking that? What does that say about what kind of person you are? How do you feel about the person you find yourself to be? `

You can do all of this in a page!
